- 3 Clutter and organization:** Open floor plans require careful organization and tidiness. Fewer places to hide messes and more visible clutter mean committing to regular cleaning.



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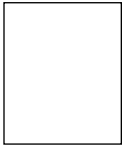


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Creating a Playroom for Your Children
